Chairman's Annual Report

Dear College and Transit Consortium Members:

As we come to the end of 2006, I am pleased to share with you that the Consortium has had another successful year and continues to demonstrate a strong commitment for the transit training needs of our region. I am honored and privileged to have served this past year as your Chairman, and look forward to another productive year to come.

This year, we restructured our regular meeting schedule to coincide with the calendar year, allowing for greater consistency with our plans, goals and objectives. We have remained focused on our strategic intent and the delivery of training for our employees.

Over the past year, the committees have worked extremely hard, demonstrating measurable results at all levels.

At the Legislative and Financial level, our earmark was officially awarded by the Federal Transportation Administration (FTA) in September. We also received authorization for use of the Transportation Electronic Award Management system (TEAM), allowing for online project reporting and direct communications with FTA.

The earmark remains to be the pinnacle toward our future training delivery, with \$1.2 million allocated over the next four-years. In addition, thanks to the efforts of Rio Hondo College, an Industrial Driven Regional Collaborative grant (IDRC) was awarded for \$500,000 over the next two-years. Moreover, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), through ITS America, awarded a phase III contract in the amount of \$75,000 in support of the SCRTTC learning model for regional expansion, and professional capacity building. Overall, the strength of both our product and our vision has been integral in getting our funding partners to recognize the value of investing in the SCRTTC.

At the Organizational level, the SCRTTC was successful in achieving the non-profit status under the IRS code 501(c) 3. I am also pleased to report that Consortium membership has remained at thirty (30) organizations, and the member fee structure was revised and approved by the Board to be part of an annual review process, along with many other policies and procedures. The diversity and commitment on the part of all member transit agencies, community colleges and educational institutions has been a strong point of the SCRTTC, and will continue to benefit our employees and future students.

At the Planning level, the Wheel of Learning tool was developed to include four major training tracts. These training tracts will be the impetus behind the courses and curriculum developed and delivered for our employees. In addition, our website has been reorganized and now includes an online registration module. As of this writing, 77 personnel will have attended classes, which include 1248 total hours of training delivered, inclusive of 120 hours of "Train-the-Trainer-Electrical for Transit" module planned before year's end.
