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APTA's Vice President of Program Management and Educational Services Joins SCR TTC Board of Directors

Los Angeles, CA - The Southern California Transit Training Consortium (SCR TTC) is pleased to announce that Pamela L. Boswell, Vice President of Program Management and Educational Services of the American Public Transportation Association (APTA), has accepted an invitation to serve on the SCR TTC's Board of Directors.

Ms. Boswell joined APTA in January 1999 and has 25 years experience in the public transportation industry. She oversees APTA's comprehensive and diverse program management and educational services program for APTA members. She also oversees staff's efforts to "mainstream" workforce development into APTA's programs, committees and activities, and provides programmatic support to the industry on these issues.

Ms. Boswell directs APTA's program planning process for major conferences, meetings, seminars and workshops; leadership development programs; web-based educational services and APTA's Foundation. She has served on numerous technical advisory panels as part of the Transit Cooperative Research Program conducted by the Transportation Research Board (TRB), and served on TRB's Transit Management and Performance Committee for three years.

In 2006, Ms. Boswell received the "Educator" award from the Metropolitan Washington, DC Chapter of the Conference of Minority Transportation Officials at its "Salute to Women in Transportation Awards," honoring prominent women in the transportation industry.

Prior to joining APTA, Ms. Boswell served as Manager, Government and Community Relations for The Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, an independent bi-state transportation authority serving the New York/New Jersey metropolitan region. In this capacity, Boswell oversaw the intergovernmental and public affairs activities for the Port Authority's interstate transportation operations. She joined the Port Authority in 1985 and held several positions of ascending responsibility for government and community relations, public participation initiatives, transportation policy, capital planning and project management for transit, highway, aviation and maritime projects.

The SCR TTC is a coalition of over 27 transit operators, community colleges and other educational institutions in Southern California, joined together to develop industry driven, competency based curriculum that meets present and future technological needs of public transit systems. The SCR TTC has been designated as a 501c(3) organization, as well as a California Non-Profit Corporation.
