SCR TTC Announces Newest Transit Member

Los Angeles, CA -The Southern California Transit Training Consortium (**SCR TTC**) is proud to announce its most recent transit member, Gold Coast Transit (GCT).

GCT provides fixed-route bus and paratransit services to a large service area of approximately 91 square miles and a population of 375,000, including the cities of Ojai, Oxnard, Port Hueneme and Ventura, and in the unincorporated County areas between the cities.

The GCT fleet consists of 54 transit buses (clean burning compressed natural gas (CNG), and 24 CNG paratransit buses and vans. In FY 2010 GCT transported over 3.5 million passengers in their fixed route and paratransit services.

GCT is a joint powers agency governed by a Board of Directors appointed by a governing body of five member agencies. Steven P. Brown is GCT's General Manager

ABOUT SCR TTC

The SCR TTC has delivered over 23,000 hours of training to over more than 1,800 transit employees that maintain vehicles in Southern California.

This SCR TTC organization was created and incorporated in January 2004 in response to the industry's need for a trained technical/mechanical labor work force. The SCR TTC will benefit the transit industry and educational institutions by the development of a bottoms-up industry driven competency based curriculum and training program that meets present and future needs in the Southern California region. This collaborative effort brings together 31 Community Colleges, Transit Agencies and Universities to develop a regional mechanism for the coordination and development of training for the technical workforce within the transportation industry.
